## Waiting with Hope

We live in a fast-paced, instant gratification culture, where waiting is seen as a bad thing. We don't like waiting at red lights or for trains to pass. But the Bible describes many instances of God patiently waiting before acting. Over 400 years passed before God freed the people of Israel from slavery in Egypt. He waited over a millennium after that before sending His Son to earth. And He's still waiting for just the right time for that Son to return to earth to claim His people. Waiting can be difficult. Yet we do not wait in despair. We can wait with the hope that God is restoring our lives and is working things out for our good.

#### Soak It In

If there is a tree outside your window, take a minute to gaze at it. Consider its height and width. A tree gains water and nourishment from the soil. The xylem of a tree—the cells that form the rings of a tree—enable the tree to take water out of the soil and therefore "feed" the leaves. A tree has to continually take in water to refresh its leaves. If the tree didn't take in water, the leaves would wither. The same is true for us. While we understand the need for proper hydration, sometimes we forget to "hydrate" through the Word. Busy schedules, problems, and other obstacles keep our spiritual "xylems" from soaking in refreshment. Instead we are bombarded by images and words that do not help us to grow. God delights to fill you with His love and wisdom from His Word.

## You'll Be Complete

Many times we create lists for ourselves that are impossible to finish, or the interruptions of other activities took up the time we thought we'd have to check off the tasks on our lists. What a relief to know that the Lord never leaves anything undone. He finishes the job at hand. That includes the work He has begun in you. You may not have completed everything you set out to do today, but rest assured that your list will be there tomorrow. Tonight, thank the Master Craftsman for His continued patient work with you. Remember that quality workmanship takes time and intricate crafting. You will one day be a completed work of exquisite design because God always finishes what He starts.

#### Points to Ponder

- Focus your affections on things in Heaven today, and you will find the problems of earth growing smaller.
- If God chastens you, quickly respond to His correction and trust in His love.
- Rest in God today. He is never late, and in His time, He will work His purpose in your life.
- Do not allow the devil to enslave you through sin and steal away the freedom Christ purchased for you.
- Forgive those who have wronged you in the same gracious way God has forgiven you.
- Someone who will cross your path today desperately needs the help and encouragement you can provide.
- View your struggles as a tool God can use for your improvement, and you will find the pressure easier to endure.
